- Then he got two years to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ to them.
- Yet many of those who heard Paul missed heaven by mere spiritual inches.
- But Paul continued making the most of every situation, every storm, every conversation.

- The book of Acts ends abruptly, showing that the history of the church was not yet complete.
